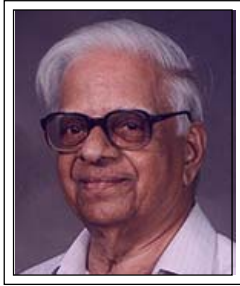


A.P. Seethapathy Rural Electrification Excellence Award



The IEEE A.P. Seethapathy Rural Electrification Excellence Award was established in 2008 to recognize exceptional power engineers who have worked, implemented or innovated better and cheaper electrification technologies for the rural sector. To be eligible for the award, an individual must be active in the field of rural electrification for at least 5 years.

The family of A.P. Seethapathy established the award to honor his passion to ensure electrification in rural environments. In his life work, A.P. Seethapathy worked to promote affordable energy in developing countries and rural electrification as an engineering priority. This award recognizes individuals who share the late A.P. Seethapathy's vision of rural electrification.

The award is co-funded by the IEEE Power & Energy Society and the IEEE Industry Applications Society. The initial endowment was funded in part by a donation from the family of A.P. Seethapathy.

The recipient receives a sculpture, a certificate, \$US500, and a travel stipend of up to \$US1,500.

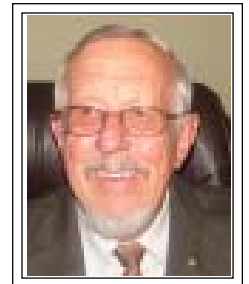
